Two scholarships were funded by our power supplier Tri-State Generation & Transmission Association and one scholarship was provided courtesy of our associate membership with Basin Electric Power Cooperative. Scholarships are \$500 per semester per student. Congratulations to the Scholarship recipients and to the graduating class of 2018.

Scholarship applicants must be either an active member or of the

immediate family of an active member pursuing higher education at a four-year college or university or community college or vocational/technical school. Scholarships are available to graduating high school students as well as non-traditional students.

Scholarships are funded through escheat monies. These are unclaimed capital credits or deposits that prior to the establishment of the fund were turned over to the respective states. Members assist in funding the "Operation Round Up" program have their electric bill rounded up to the nearest dollar each month and those monies are deposited into the Scholarship Fund. Call the Co-op office to join in this effort.

Two of our core principles are put into action through the scholarship program: Education, Training and Information, and Concern for Community. Giving educational opportunities to members of the communities we serve helps families who might otherwise struggle to pay for their education. Giving more people the opportunity to take advantage of higher education strengthens the fabric of our local communities. For Columbus Electric that's a win-win situation. We realize that the health of the cooperative is inextricably tied to the well-being of the community. So grows the community, so grows the cooperative.
