

Distribution Maintenance Work to Begin in Spanish Stirrup Area

Columbus Electric Cooperative, Inc. (CEC) will be contracting WSI Southwest, Inc., a New Mexico electrical contracting service company, to perform maintenance work on a portion of the distribution system served out of the Spanish Stirrup substation in Deming. This includes the areas south of Deming up to the New Frontier and Brazil Road areas. Members in these areas have been experiencing frequent service interruptions. Maintenance work is being performed in an effort to improve the service and reliability.

Work to be performed includes the testing of all poles, inspection of all equipment and connections, tightening of hardware, and replacement of equipment as needed. Work is scheduled to begin on July 13th and will continue for four (4) weeks. Contractor vehicles will be clearly marked.

CEC is committed to making continued investments in the distribution system in order to continue to provide our members with safe, reliable, affordable power for the future.
